Have you ever considered the importance of the mass of the earth?

Scientists tell us that the mass of the earth is vital to life on earth. Consider the moon for example. While the moon is within the 'habitable zone' of the sun, it cannot support life because it has too little mass (and hence too little gravity) to keep any significant atmosphere. rotation, the earth is balanced in such a way as to absorb these events and keep right on spinning (at 1,000 miles per hour rotationally and 67,000 miles an hour around the sun).

How was the mass of the earth determined? Was it really evolution and random chance? I don't think so! The method in which the mass of the earth was determined is found in Isaiah 40:12.

"Who hath measured the waters in the hollow of his hand, and meted out heaven with the span, and comprehended the dust of the earth in a measure, and weighed the mountains in scales, and the hills in a balance?" Isaiah 40:12

The answer to the question in this verse is the Almighty, Creator, God!

God made the recipe of the earth! He measured the waters in the hollow of His hand! Have you ever made your favorite recipe and measured out a special ingredient by the handful? That's what God did with the waters of the earth! He measured it out in just the right amount with His hand!
